## Significant developments

- Informal Group on CWG-Internet concludes without any agreement on topics for future consultations and will recommend Council refer topic selection back to CWG-Internet.
- Informal Working Group on WTPF-21 ends with agreement on timing, theme and draft decision for Council to approve.

## Other developments on Day 6

- ITU Council was presented with an overview of the report of the United Nations Secretary-General's High-Level Panel on Digital Cooperation.
- Participants in the Informal Group on the topic of the next two open consultations of the CWG-Internet agreed that it was not going to be possible to reach consensus on topics. From the many proposed topics submitted to Council, three topics had been the main focus of discussions:
  - . Capacity building on Internet governance for developing countries (this had been close to, but didn't guite managed to, reach consensus during the January CWG-Internet meeting)
  - Al/machine learning
  - Affordable Internet connectivity

The first two topics had the strongest levels of support, but also the strongest levels of objection. Efforts to have both topics accepted, using the method invoked by the CWG-Internet in 2017, where gender and OTTs – both of which had Member States objecting to them - were agreed as topics for the next two upcoming consultations, making "everyone equally unhappy", was unsuccessful in the Informal Group, as differences of opinion were too deeply divided to be solved in the same manner. The new Chair of the Informal Group (the previous Chair having left Geneva over the weekend) will report to https://www.nissaba.net 3 Plenary that the group proposes returning discussion and decision on the open consultation topic to the CWG-Internet when it next meets in September.

- The Informal Working Group on WTPF-21 completed its work. The proposed overarching theme for Plenary to approve: "Policies to mobilise new and emerging telecommunications/ICTs for sustainable development". <u>https://www.itu.int/md/S19-CL-190610-DL-0009/en</u>
- The Global Cybersecurity Agenda (GCA) informal consultations concluded its work, recommending that Council instruct the Secretary-General submit a report to Council 2020 explaining how ITU is currently utilizes the GCA framework and, with the involvement of Member States, develop appropriate guidelines developed for ITU's utilization of the GCA, to be approved by Council. https://www.itu.int/md/S19-CL-190610-DL-0008/en
