Significant developments

- Dates of ITU Plenipotentiary Conference 2022 confirmed by Council as 26 September – 14 October 2022. Location previously agreed: Bucharest, Romania.
- Discussions on the ITU headquarters rebuilding project are ongoing.

Informal consultations

1. BACK AGAIN: Informal Group on CWG-Internet open consultation topics

Plenary Chair asked group to try once more. It tried. Reached same conclusion: no consensus possible.

2. Informal consultations on Union's headquarters premises project

To discuss how to move forward with concerns expressed by some Council members about past cost increases,

and potential future cost increases for the headquarters rebuilding project.

Plenary¹

Endorsed:

- The *Package of documents concerning ITU Internet activities under Resolutions 101, 102, 133 and 180* to be transmitted to the UN Secretary-General. The package consists of:
 - Report by the Secretary-General: ITU Internet Activities: Resolutions 101, 102, 133, and 180 (C19/33)
 - One written contribution submitted by an ITU Council Member State on the report
 - Official ITU Council Summary Record of the related verbal discussions held during Council

Standing Committee for Administration and Management (ADM)

Noted:

ADM had been unable to reach consensus on whether to approve going forward with a second phase of the rebuilding loan with the host country, Switzerland. The ADM did not reach consensus on a proposed way forward: to hold an extraordinary meeting later this year to review additional documents related to the headquarters rebuilding project. If the proposed extraordinary meeting were to happen, and Council was satisfied with the additional information provided at the meeting, Council could then proceed to approve going forward with a second phase of the rebuilding loan.

The report contained a summary of the ADM Committee's deliberations over its 10 sessions during Council 2019. Over the 10 meetings, the ADM:

- Considered 72 documents
- Adopted 4 Council Resolutions
- 7 Council Decisions

Square brackets (indicating lack of consensus) remain around the recommendation that the Council hold an extraordinary meeting later this year to review additional documents related to the headquarters rebuilding project.

When the document is available in the six UN languages, it will become a "Contribution" document and be presented to Plenary for consideration.

Other developments on Day 8

- The Informal Group for Identifying Topics for **Open Consultation for the Council Working Group on International Internet-related Public Policy Issues** (CWG-Internet) reported to Plenary that it had been unable to reach consensus on a topic for future open consultations. The Council Chair requested the group reconvene one more time to attempt to find consensus. The informal group meet during the lunch break, but was again unable to reach consensus. As a result, the September meeting of the CWG-Internet will not have an open consultation process preceding it. The September meeting of the CWG-Internet will then discuss topics for the CWG-Internet's meeting in January 2020.
- Discussions on the **ITU headquarters rebuilding project** continued to dominate the discussions of the ADM on its last day of meetings. The final decision on the way forward will be made by Plenary on 20 June.
