In brief

Day 9 was the final day of ITU Council 2019, so was a mostly procedural affair, with the remaining documents being presented and acted on with relatively little debate. Of special note:

 Plenary agreed to hold an extraordinary one-day Council session in September to discuss additional detailed information requested about the ITU headquarters rebuilding project and then decide how best to move forward with the project.
